## **Disability Organizations You Can Partner With**

National Disability Organizations:

- 1. <u>ADA National Network</u> Provides guidance and training on how to implement ADA requirements.
- 2. <u>American Association of People with Disabilities</u> Largest national non-profit cross-disability organization. Works to ensure economic and political self-advocacy for people with disabilities.
- 3. <u>National Organization on Disability</u> Raises disability awareness through providing information.
- 4. <u>Different & Able</u> Supports people with disabilities and their families.
- 5. <u>National Center for Learning Disabilities</u> Provides information to parents and professionals and conducts research and programs.
- 6. <u>Alzheimer's Association</u> Raising awareness on Alzheimer's and promoting research.
- 7. <u>Cerebral Palsy Group</u> Provides online resources for families and those with Cerebral Palsy.
